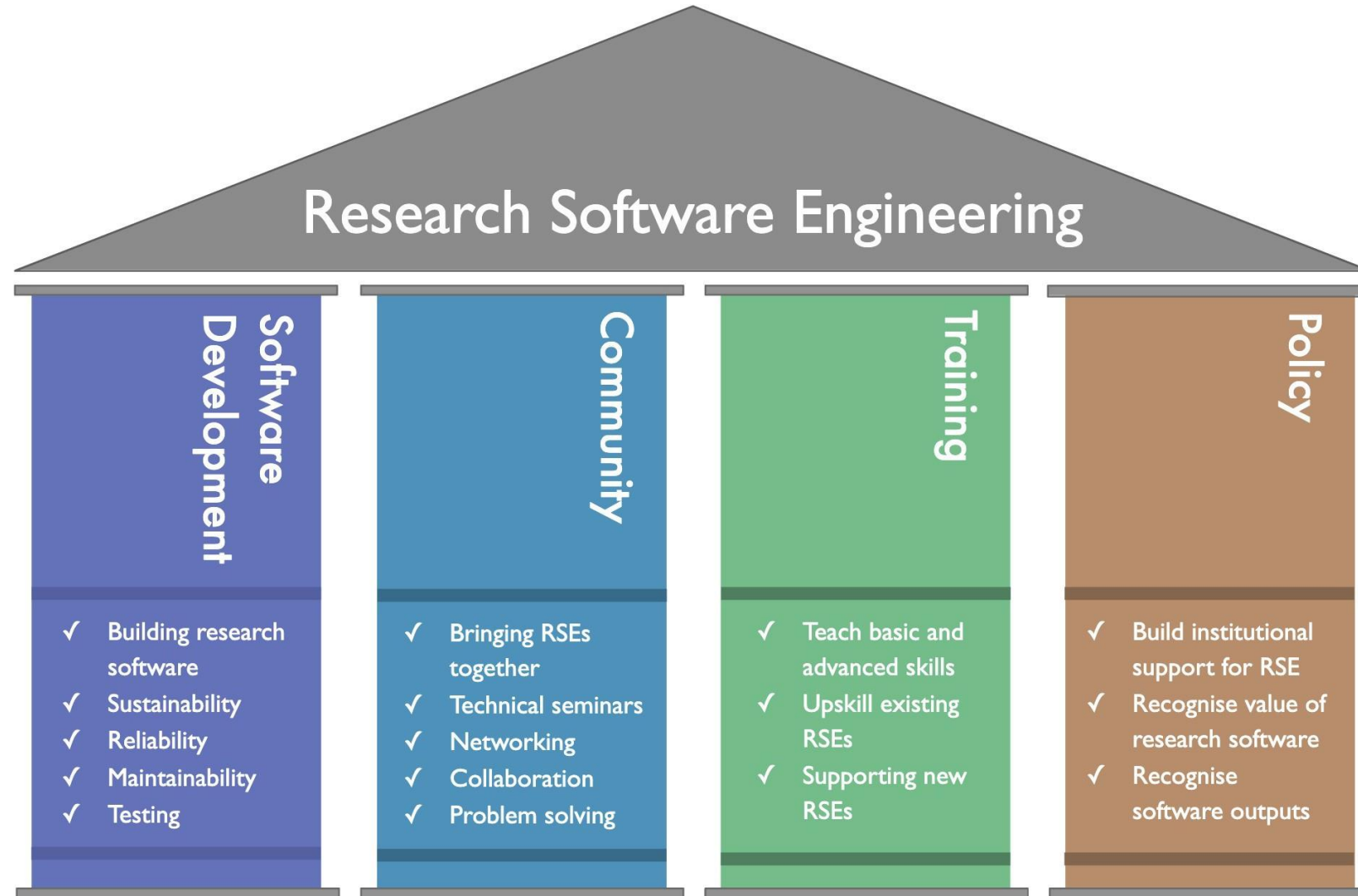

Motivations:

- To provide a unique job title that is easier to search for and to advertise than all the little variations like “scientific programmer”, “research software specialist”, etc.
- To highlight the importance of software (especially sustainable software development) and those who develop it in modern research.
- To create communities of like-minded people who share common interests.

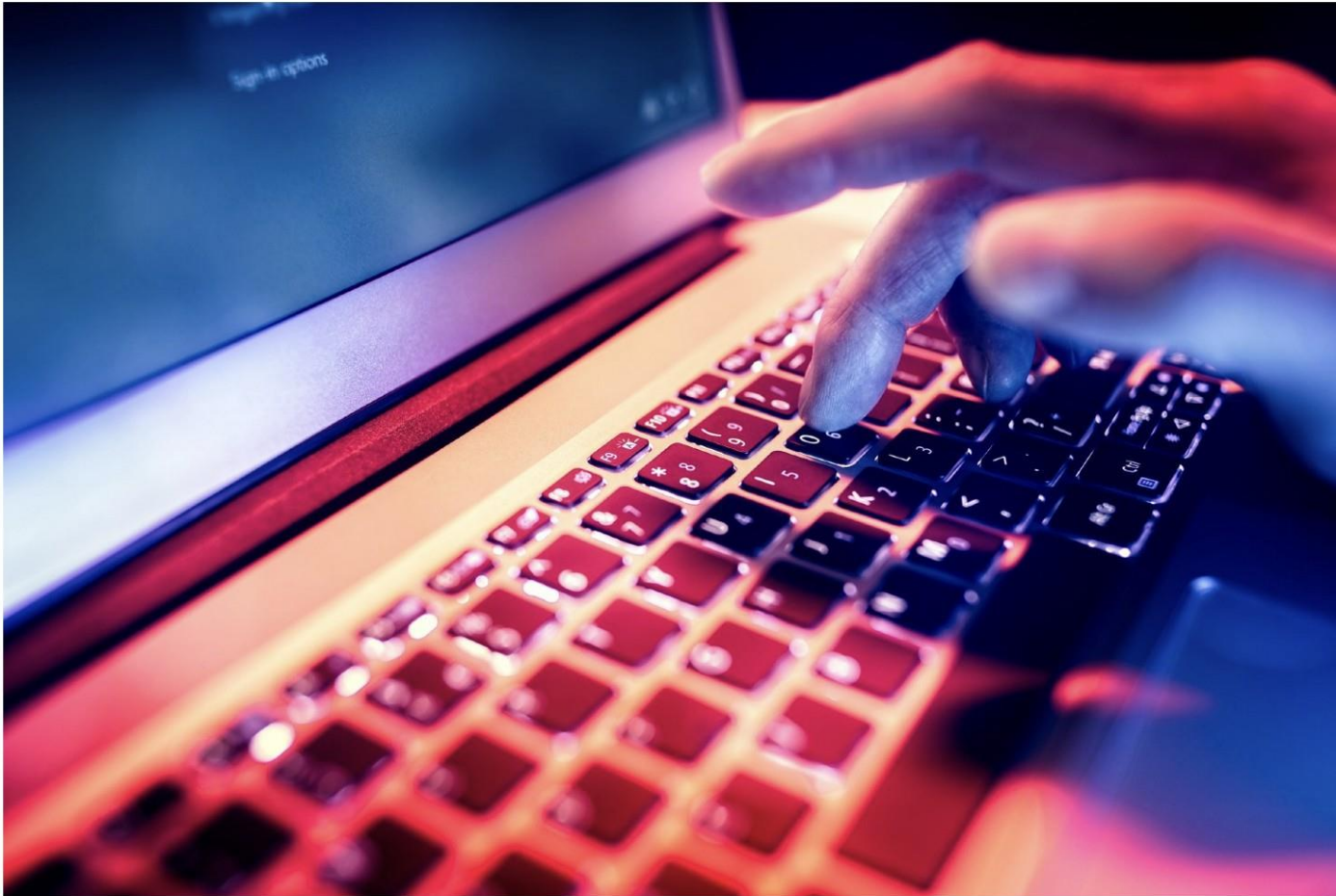
Our history with The Carpentries

The Institute became involved with what was then **Software Carpentry** (now a lesson programme within The Carpentries) in 2011 by developing online lectures in advanced shell tricks and systems programming in Python. In April 2012, we participated in **the first UK Carpentry workshop**, led by the Software Carpentry's creator, Greg Wilson, at the University College London. A fortnight later, in conjunction with the **Digital Institute** at Newcastle University and **SoundSoftware**, we delivered the **first workshop run entirely by UK instructors**, independent of Greg Wilson's team.

We have since been involved in a large number of workshops run in the UK and helped to deliver workshops worldwide. In February 2013, **we volunteered to coordinate Software Carpentry activities in the UK**. In early 2015, soon after the set up of the **Organisational Membership** scheme, we became a Software Carpentry Foundation Partner, a partnership which has now moved to The Carpentries. We inspired and helped many UK organisations and groups to start delivering Carpentry workshops and explore their individual partnerships with The Carpentries.

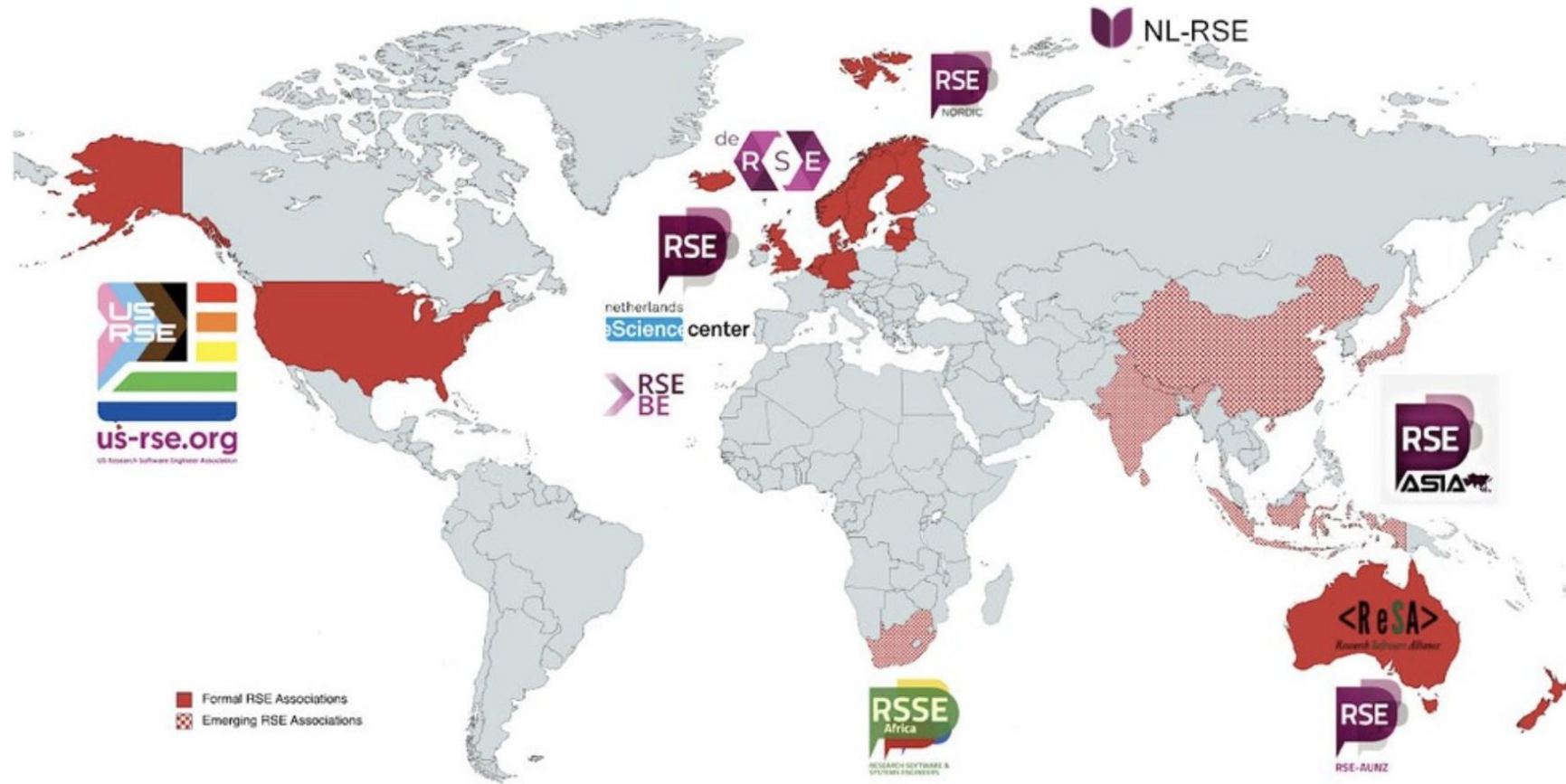

RSE community @ ETH: first steps

- Mail campaign on the 23rd of November 2023
 - Emails to both research and technical staff
 - Incredible response
- Announced 1st online information event on 12th of December 2023

1st online information event

- Around 120 participants
- 2 parts:
 1. Talk by Prof. Simon Hettrick (Software Sustainability Institute UK)
 2. Information on community building @ ETH
 - RSE community survey
 - Q&A

Results of RSE community survey



13 out of 16 ETH Zurich departments represented!

First on-site event: 1st of February 2024

- **Part 2: Talk by Mr. Peter Schmidt**
- **Part 3: Discussion rounds in small groups:**
 - What do you expect from the RSE community?
 - What kind of role do you imagine for yourself in this community?
 - How can we build the community?

RSE@ETH Domain

- We, together with the partner institutions in the ETH domain, submitted a proposal for funding to ORD measure 2, which was accepted
- RSE4ORD: building a research software engineering community to promote open science

RSE4ORD:

- Project started October 2024: 0.75 FTE/year for 2 years
- Kicking-off RSE communities at partner institutions:
RSE@ETH will help get started
- Promoting FAIR (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable) for research software
- Guidelines for RSE

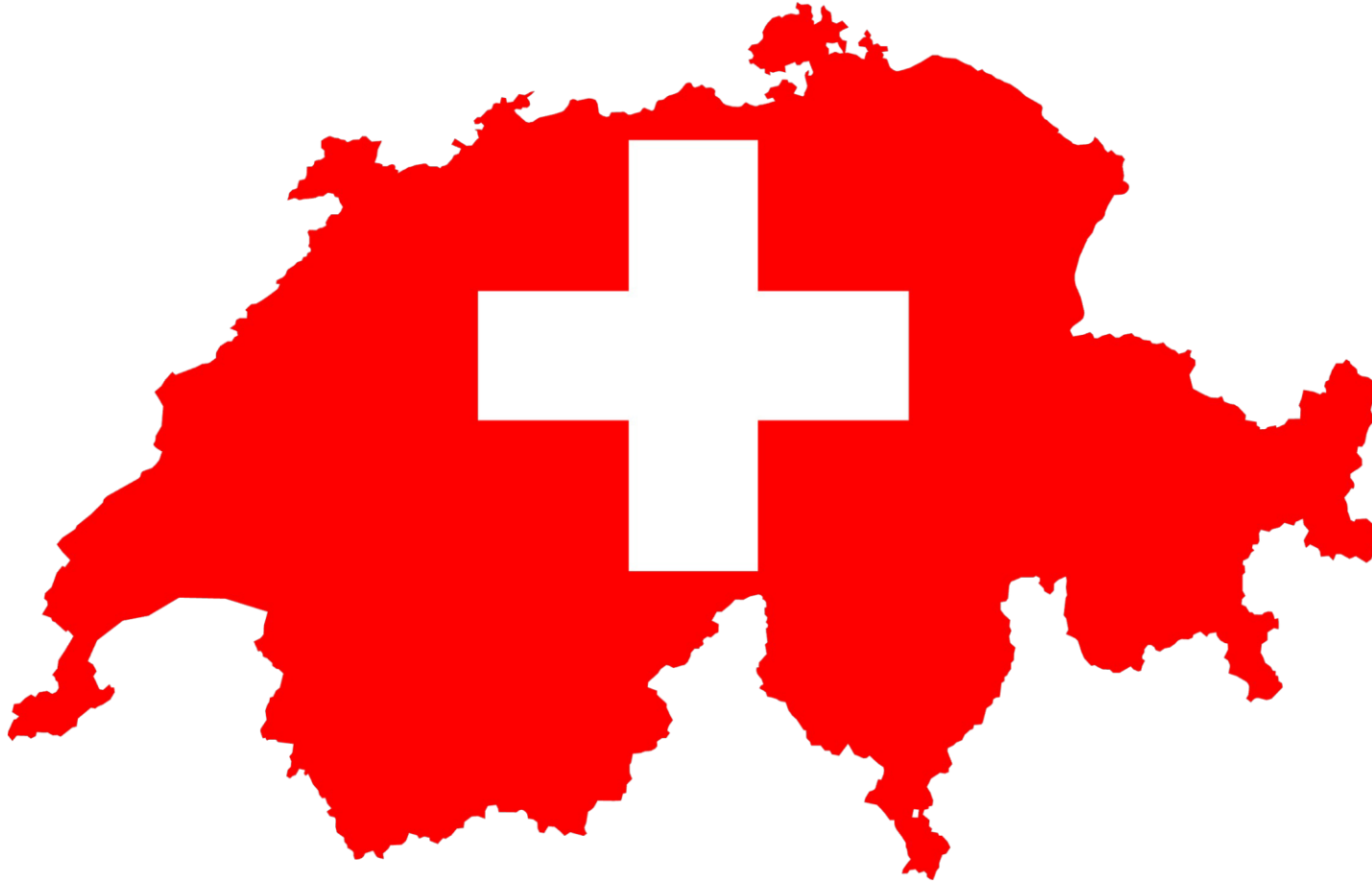
