World Conference on Research Integrity

May 5-8, 2013 Montreal

Building on the momentum of the first two World Conferences on Research Integrity in Lisbon (2007) and Singapore (2010), the third World Conference will bring together national and institutional leaders, researchers, policy makers, research funders, administrators, journal editors and leaders of professional societies to address breaking issues related to research integrity. Attendees will have opportunities to learn how research organizations worldwide approach integrity issues and cope with challenges to research integrity.
